Connecting K-12 Students with Art

The Buy-A-Bus program started in 2008, and reimburses K-12 travel costs to the museum within a 100-mile radius. The program reaches out to over 300 schools in 21 counties across 3 states. Funds for Buy-A-Bus ensure that travel costs do not stop schools from visiting an art museum and bringing the wonders of art to the mind of a child.



OUR STORY

The Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art WSU

Situated amongst the rolling hills of the southeastern Washington region known as the Palouse, the museum is integrated into the cultural fabric of Washington State University Pullman, a beautiful, state-of-the-art campus with more than 200 academic programs.

Since 1974, the museum has hosted outstanding art exhibitions, has supported a wide range of educational programs, and has shared a substantial collection of artwork with students and visitors. In 2018, through the generosity of

Jordan D. Schnitzer and multiple donors, the museum inaugurated a majestic, purpose-built facility within the heart of campus. Designed by architect Jim Olson, the Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art at Washington State University (JSMA) is affectionately nicknamed the ‘crimson cube’.

The continuing mission of the JSMA is to inspire, engage, and educate diverse audiences through the power of art. As the largest, dedicated art museum between Seattle and Missoula, the museum is a vital point of art access across the Pacific Northwest. The museum’s core audience is WSU students—and for many of them, this is the first art museum they have visited.



COLLECTION STUDIES

The museum houses a collection of 4,000+ priceless works in the Collection Study Center (CSC), and is home to the Patricia W. and Samuel H. Smith Collection Classroom. This state-of-the-art space conducts object-based learning, bringing art to students, faculty, and visiting professionals.
